1. SHORT SUMMARY

- What will the students learn?

2. PRACTICAL ACTIVITY

(45 min.)

Depending on the topic you have chosen for the public event and the preparation the students have had in the previous class period, this lesson is the time during which the public event will actually happen.

You can hold it in a cinema hall or other larger room in your school.

Make sure that you make a list of invitees in advance and send out invitations at least one week before the event describing what the topic of the event will be. You can have a student in the class help you with that task. You might want to ensure some minimal catering for all the participants in the public event as well. This is where parents could also help.

In case some of the guests have an active role to play during the event, make sure that you acknowledge their contribution by handing them a certificate or a small gift. The students who take part in the event should also receive certificates.
